# JANUARY 2008 UPDATE FROM THE WILHELM REICH INFANT TRUST & THE WILHELM REICH MUSEUM

Happy New Year!

We are just now catching our breath after what was, predictably, our busiest year ever. The year 2008 will be devoted to completing and pursuing several ongoing projects, while taking on many new tasks, responsibilities, and challenges.

## 2008 WRITING AND PUBLISHING PROJECTS

- Mary Higgins will be completing a manuscript for a sequel to
   American Odyssey Letters and Journals 1940-1947, which will comprise Reich's letters and journals from 1948 to the 1950s.
- All remaining volumes of Reich's *Orgone Energy Bulletin* (from January 1950 to October 1953) will become available in Xerox-bound reprints in our bookstore. We had hoped to complete this project in 2007, but unfortunately didn't have enough time due to other activities.
- **Bion Experiments on the Cancer Problem**, Reich's 1939 publication, will become available in a Xerox-bound reprint in our bookstore. This 25-page little-known work—published in English while Reich was still in Oslo—is a succinct and compelling account of Reich's discovery of the T-bacilli and its significance in the development of cancer.
- Wilhelm Reich in America is the working title for a book that Kevin Hinchey is currently researching and outlining, which will focus on Reich's medical and natural scientific research in the United States.
- Unpublished materials in The Archives of the Orgone Institute will be studied and evaluated on an ongoing basis as potential manuscripts for future book and journal publications. More about this later in the Update.

# 2008 FILM PROJECTS

It's a frustrating reality of the film business that it commonly takes years to bring movie projects to fruition. But the Trust is continuing its efforts to develop two factual, intellectually honest films about Reich's life and work:

- A full-length documentary film about Wilhelm Reich

# 2008 OFFICE PROJECTS

- We'll be upgrading the Trust & Museum office (located in Orgonon's Conference Building, formerly Reich's "Students Laboratory") with an additional computer workstation and faster Internet access.
- In our office we have literally hundreds of photographs which document Reich's life and work, as well as activities at Orgonon since the 1960s. We'll be scanning these photographs onto a single computer database to provide easy access to these visual resources for future projects.
- The Wilhelm Reich Museum website (<a href="www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org">www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org</a>), which averages 95 hits per day, will undergo some design changes to provide greater emphasis on The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust and its duties, responsibilities, and activities.

# ENCOURAGING CURRENT RESEARCH: REICH'S BION & CANCER FILMS

The Trust maintains contact with many individuals involved in all kinds of scholarship and research pertaining to current applications of Reich's work. To encourage and assist those involved in biology, microscopy, bion research, Reich Blood Tests, and orgonomic medicine, we are donating DVDs of Reich's microscopic time-lapse bion films and cancer films to numerous researchers.

While still photographs from these films appear in several of Reich's publications (*The Bion Experiments on the Origin of Life, Bion Experiments on the Cancer Problem, The Cancer Biopathy*, among others) the time-lapse films themselves can only be viewed in The Wilhelm Reich Museum, at some of the summer conferences at Orgonon, and as excerpts in our 28-minute documentary DVD/video *Man's Right to Know*.

We are frequently asked if we plan to sell DVDs of these films in our Bookstore. Unfortunately, Internet piracy of our Bookstore materials is rampant. For example, *Man's Right to Know* is often posted illegally on Internet sites. Consequently, we have no plans to sell DVDs of Reich's bion and cancer films.

# PLANNING OUR NEXT CONFERENCE: June 2009 – New York City

No, neither the date nor the place is a misprint. For the first time since the late 1970s, the Wilhelm Reich Museum will *not* be holding its annual summer conference at Orgonon, which ordinarily would have been July 14 - 19, 2008. We have two reasons for this:

First, because of our inordinately busy schedule in 2007, we desperately need to catch up on all kinds of work pertaining to the Trust and Museum, while simultaneously taking on new projects and responsibilities. So, unfortunately, we simply don't have the time or resources this year to put together a formal summer conference at Orgonon.

Secondly, after the success of our 2007 International Conference on Orgonomy in Rangeley, Maine—with a total attendance of 120 people—we want to explore the possibility of organizing an even more ambitious International Conference in a major American city.

This conference will focus specifically on Orgonomic Medicine and Orgonomic Science, both during Reich's lifetime and currently. We hope that an easily accessible urban venue will attract even more people who might not be able or willing to make the long trip to Rangeley, Maine.

# MANAGING THE ACCESS TO THE ARCHIVES OF THE ORGONE INSTITUTE

On October 29th, 2007 we posted the "Index of the Archives of the Orgone Institute" on our website, plus a "History of the Archives" and the "Access Policies & Procedures." (www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/resources.html#archives)

With the posting of this information, The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust's Archive Committee began accepting applications from scholars and researchers wishing to study archival materials at the Countway Library of Medicine at Harvard University. And since then, numerous applications have been processed and people have visited the Countway Library to study archival materials of interest.

The opening of Reich's Archives to scholars and researchers launches a new and significant responsibility for The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust, for which we need to constantly balance

our interests with those of individuals who are involved in bonafide endeavors concerning Reich's legacy. And to effectively strike this intellectually honest balance, we need to continually and transparently address relevant issues and concerns regarding the Archives.

For example, anyone with a genuine interest in Reich's legacy should have some basic understanding of the magnitude of The Archives of the Orgone Institute.

# **QUANTITY OF MATERIAL IN THE ARCHIVES**

Most people, justifiably, lack any true sense of just how enormous this collection is. To better appreciate the sheer volume of material in the Archives, we suggest this:

- First, consider the fact that Reich's Archives contain approximately 98 cubic-feet of material, making this one of the largest collections at the Countway Library of Medicine. To better understand the actual size of 98 cubic-feet, imagine an ordinary box measuring one-foot by one-foot by one-foot, filled with papers, notebooks, photographs, films, and other materials. Then imagine 98 of these boxes filled with these materials.
- Next, devote some time to browsing the 141-page Index of the Archives of the Orgone Institute (<a href="www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/archive\_index.pdf">www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/archive\_index.pdf</a>), which lists the names of *hundreds of files of material* that are currently housed in 282 archive boxes.
- Keeping in mind that the Archives contain *hundreds of files of material*, consider the fact that each of these individual files contains anywhere from one page or one item, to dozens of pages or dozens of items, to hundreds of pages of materials. Then do the arithmetic.
- And as you browse the 141-page Index of the Archives of the Orgone Institute, take note also of the wealth of *handwritten material*, i.e. manuscripts, notebooks, laboratory protocols, etc.

Our point is simply this: The Archives of the Orgone Institute contain literally thousands and thousands of pages (both typed and handwritten), hundreds of slides and photographs, dozens of films and audio recordings, and other materials.

Which brings us, inevitably, to the next major issue: Who, if anyone, has actually read all of the thousands of pages in the Archives? Who, if anyone, has actually looked at all of the visual materials, and listened to all of the audio recordings?

With the presumable exception of Reich throughout the course of his life, no one has read, looked at, or listened to the entire 98 cubic-feet of archival materials. Indeed, how would such a thing be possible?

In other words, although the archival materials have been preserved, organized, and catalogued by Category, File, Document, and other designations, the specific contents of much of these materials are unknown.

And among the materials whose specific contents are unknown are numerous files containing vast collections of Reich's unpublished scientific work.

## REICH'S UNPUBLISHED SCIENTIFIC WORK

When we compare the indexes of other medical and scientific archives to that of Reich's, what is unusual and striking is the enormous amount of *unpublished* scientific work in The Archives of the Orgone Institute. Which, for the sake of this discussion, includes Reich's equations, his Orgone Motor research, the Oranur Experiment, and cosmic orgone engineering, i.e. DOR removal and cloudbusting.

And it is precisely these areas of Reich's research that, for decades, have been the focus of continual curiosity and speculation. And it is precisely these areas of Reich's research that prompted our third reason for opting for more, rather than less restrictive access to the Archives (www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/archive access.html):

"To safeguard the factual truth, authorship, and future uses of what is a significant collection of unpublished scientific work."

While Reich's publications included significant information about equations, the Oranur Experiment, and cosmic orgone engineering, his Archives contain hundreds and hundreds of additional handwritten and typed pages, which document his work in these areas.

Conversely, Reich published very little about the Orgone Motor.

# THE ORGONE MOTOR

On August 8, 1947, Reich discovered a potential motor force in orgone energy when the impulse counter in a Geiger-Müller counter—which had been exposed to high concentrations of atmospheric orgone energy—suddenly began to rotate at a rate of almost 100 counts per second, i.e. almost 6000 counts per minute (CPM). Within a year—on June 24, 1948—Reich had succeeded in propelling a small Western Electric KS-9154 motor by means of the Orgone Energy Motor Force.

Unfortunately this promising research was curtailed by the erratic and irresponsible conduct of a laboratory worker who suddenly left Orgonon in the Fall of 1948, as well as by Reich's escalating problems with the Food and Drug Administration. Consequently, Reich's published information about the Orgone Motor Force is limited:

• In *The Cancer Biopathy* (1948), Reich concludes Chapter Four, "The Objective Demonstration of Orgone Radiation," with a half-page about his discovery of a motor force in orgone energy.

- In the inaugural issue of the *Orgone Energy Bulletin* (Vol. 1, No. 1, January 1949) is a five-page article entitled "A Motor Force in Orgone Energy Preliminary Communications," which includes affidavits that Reich sent to the Atomic Energy Commission.
- In *The Oranur Experiment First Report 1947-1951* (1951) Reich devotes two chapters (65 pages) to his research of a motor force in orgone energy: Chapter 3 "The Geiger-Müller Effect of Cosmic Orgone Energy (1947)" and Chapter 4 "The Orgone Energy Charged Vacuum Tubes (VACOR) (1948)"

American Odyssey – Letters and Journals 1940-1947, published in 1999, includes additional pages of Reich's contemporaneous accounts of his August 1947 discovery of a motor force in orgone energy. And Reich's films, showing a demonstration of the orgone motor itself, are among the exhibits at The Wilhelm Reich Museum, and can also be seen in *Man's Right to Know*, our 28-minute documentary DVD/video.

The remainder of Reich's documentation of his orgone energy motor force resides in his Archives: appropriately categorized, filed, and labeled...but unread and unevaluated.

These are among the most "sensitive" of the Archive's unpublished scientific materials which the Trust needs to carefully manage in terms of our responsibility "to safeguard the factual truth, authorship, and future uses of what is a significant collection of unpublished scientific work."

And among *our* "future uses" is publishing.

## FUTURE PUBLISHING FROM THE ARCHIVES

In the past, The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust has drawn from the Archives for the following publications:

And the Trust will continue to read, study, and evaluate unpublished archival materials—pertaining to all aspects of Reich's life and work—for possible publication as new books, journals, and articles. For the Trust, publishing primary materials has been, and will continue to be, both an intellectual responsibility *and* a financial necessity.

# ACCESS TO "SENSITIVE" ARCHIVAL MATERIALS

All archival issues discussed in this Update were given serious consideration over long periods of time as we crafted Access Policies and Procedures that would balance the responsibilities and needs of The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust with those of bonafide scholars and researchers. Which culminated in Item 11 of our Access Policies: (www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/archive\_access.html)

All materials in the Archives will not necessarily be accessible at all times. There are several reasons for this:

- Ongoing archival work by the Trust and the Countway Library, requiring the periodic reorganization of materials.
- Specific projects by the Trust, requiring the use of specific archival materials
- The Trust's need to identify, discuss, and resolve key issues regarding Reich's unpublished scientific work.
- The Countway Library of Medicine's guidelines and restrictions regarding patient files and medical records, which are in compliance with federal laws governing privacy and protection of health information.
- Technological limitations (for example, the Countway does not currently have capabilities for listening to audiotapes or watching films and videos).

As we mentioned, since November 2007 people have visited the Countway Library of Medicine to study archival materials of interest.

But when it comes to particularly "sensitive materials" specific to the Archives' vast collection of Reich's unpublished scientific work, the Trust will be making arrangements to jointly study these materials with scholars and researchers at Orgonon. We feel that this context will be mutually beneficial and will promote a healthy, intellectually honest exchange of ideas and understanding.

# ON THE 50<sup>th</sup> ANNIVERSARY OF REICH'S DEATH, DISTORTION & SLANDER AT THE REICH EXHIBIT IN VIENNA

As we eagerly look forward to so many new projects, responsibilities, challenges, and relationships in 2008, it saddens us to bring a sour note to this first Update of a new year.

Words scarcely express our disappointment and outrage over the Reich Exhibit at the Jewish Museum Vienna which opened on November 15, 2007, an exhibit that the Trust worked on and contributed to for over three years, with considerable expenditures of time, money, knowledge, hope, and friendship. We honestly believed that this was a valuable opportunity to present the truth about Reich's life and work to a wider audience, which is consistent with the mission of The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust.

We devoted hundreds upon hundreds of hours to providing whatever assistance we could to the exhibit's curator, far more time and effort than we spent on our 2007 International Conference on Orgonomy here in Rangeley, and far more time and effort than we spent

on our final preparations for access to The Archives of the Orgone Institute at the Countway Library of Medicine in Boston. In fact, The Wilhelm Reich Infant Trust was the single most generous contributor of "materials and objects" to the Vienna exhibit.

We donated nearly 100 carefully selected photographs from all periods of Reich's life, requiring reproduction, scanning and e-mail services from two local vendors here in Rangeley, Maine, as well as from the Countway Library staff.

We also donated 46 other "objects" to the exhibit, which were transported in two crates from The Wilhelm Reich Museum and the Countway Library to the Jewish Museum Vienna in early November 2007, the week before the exhibit opening. A member of the Trust accompanied the transport of these objects.

These objects included original German editions of Reich's early publications, various documents, original Orgone Institute Press editions of Reich's books, miscellaneous books from Reich's private library at Orgonon, drawings by cartoonist William Steig for *Listen*, *Little Man!*, one of Reich's Reichert microscopes, a Cine Kodak 16mm film camera (used to film the bion experiments in Oslo), an orgone accumulator for mice from the Oranur Experiment, two of Reich's oil paintings, Reich's Medical DOR-buster, and other items.

Equally significant are the many hours we spent from 2004 to 2007 in personal discussions and visits, phone calls, and e-mail communications with the curator about the specific "storyline" and content of the exhibit. From our first contact with the curator in 2004, one of our many concerns was that the exhibit might distort, misrepresent, or give short shrift to Reich's legacy of orgone energy research from the 1930s to the 1950s.

We made it clear that we would only participate in this exhibit if Reich's orgone energy research was portrayed as seriously and accurately as his earlier psychoanalytic and political work. We were assured early on that this was precisely the Exhibit's intent.

And over the subsequent years we were again and again reassured. Alarmingly, however, our continual input—providing key quotations and excerpts from Reich's writings, providing timelines, and consistently emphasizing the energy principle underlying all of Reich's work and theories—seemed to have no effect on the emerging design and content of the exhibit.

By late 2006 it was obvious to us that among the exhibit organizers there was insufficient interest and knowledge about Reich's research in biology, medicine, and natural science from 1934 to 1957, research that comprised over one third of Reich's entire life and over half of his professional career.

And in early 2007 we were shocked to discover that the exhibit catalog would be devoting only a minimal number of pages to Reich's research from 1934-1957, while dozens of pages would be given to articles by numerous scholars about Reich's early life and work.

In March 2007, in a long e-mail to the curator, we said that we were now undecided about what further contributions we wished to make to an exhibit that we did not feel was adequately representing the truth and breadth of Reich's work. And with that, we seriously considered severing all ties with the Vienna exhibit and refusing to send any objects from The Wilhelm Reich Museum.

The curator immediately promised to devote more catalog pages to Reich's orgone research. We were also assured, yet again, that Reich's own words would be used as much as possible as labeling in the exhibit, rather than someone else's "explanation" or "interpretation"—something we'd been insisting on for years.

Although we had sadly lost our enthusiasm for the exhibit, after considerable discussion we decided to continue our participation for one reason: we honestly felt that our continued efforts might at least improve the exhibit's presentation of Reich's organe energy research.

Among our continued efforts for the exhibit organizers was our painstaking compilation of 50 pages of chronologically-arranged key excerpts from *The Bioelectrical Investigation of Sexuality and Anxiety, The Bion Experiments on the Origin of Life, Bion Experiments on the Cancer Problem, The Cancer Biopathy, The Oranur Experiment, The Orgone Energy Accumulator – Its Scientific and Medical Use, the CORE bulletins, as well as journal entries from Beyond Psychology and American Odyssey—excerpts that clearly and succinctly explained the entire development of Reich's biological, medical, and natural scientific work in his own words.* 

Unfortunately, when the Reich Exhibit finally opened on November 15, 2007, its presentation of Reich's orgone energy research was worse than we could have imagined:

- A piece of radioactive material had been included in the Exhibit in close proximity to a full-sized 5-layer orgone accumulator, Reich's Medical DOR-buster, and a mouse accumulator—an unnecessary, reckless, dangerous decision by exhibit organizers that showed either ignorance of Reich's scientific findings in the Oranur Experiment, or complete contempt for his findings.
- The overall presentation of Reich's orgone research was incoherent and had a slapdash quality about it, with years of Reich's research completely ignored, some objects left unexplained, and occasionally snide labeling with no use of Reich's own words.
- An exhibit catalog marred by inaccuracies, editorializing, and snide innuendo, such as the reference on the outside back cover to "...objects relevant to so-called orgone research."

Equally offensive was an "artist's exhibit" in a small room adjacent to the main exhibit.

From early on, we were told there would be an "artist's exhibit" on Reich, about which we immediately expressed serious concern, based on previous experiences with artists. (see: <a href="www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/06\_05\_update.html#factual">www.wilhelmreichmuseum.org/06\_05\_update.html#factual</a>) But the contents were never revealed to us and were not yet installed when the Trust representative was at the Jewish Museum Vienna on November 9, 2007 to oversee the unpacking of our two crates of objects.

The "artist's exhibit" is entitled "A Journey with Mr. Reich and Oz Almog [the artist] Through the Gates of Hell," and includes the following statements: "Phenomena called 'electrosmog' today led the eccentric scientist to believe in the existence of 'orgone'." "Faith and inspiration, rather than strict methodology, led Reich into increasingly bizarre regions, culminating in an energy converter and weather machine called 'cloud buster'." "Reich's heirs today form a fanatic and often esoterically inspired fan community." "Spirit researcher Reich…" "...creator of a pseudo-scientific Disneyland."

Had we been aware of the contents of this "artist's exhibit" at any time in the past few years, we would have refused to loan any materials or objects to the museum, and would not have cooperated in any way. Had this "artist's exhibit" been installed and viewed when our two crates of objects arrived in November 2007, we would not have allowed our objects to be unpacked and installed.

After explaining the dangers of this radioactive material to the exhibit organizers on the day after the opening, we made numerous demands over several weeks to have the material removed—including threats to remove our objects from the exhibit. Finally, the material was reluctantly taken out, although the curator continued to insist it was completely safe to have this radioactive material near organe accumulating devices.

We also wrote a four-page letter to the director of the museum, expressing our outrage and disappointment with the "artist's exhibit" and the fact that its contents seemed to have been purposely kept from us. The director repeatedly insisted that the Reich Exhibit and the "artist's exhibit" on Reich are in no way connected, despite the fact that one needs to walk *through* the Reich Exhibit to get to the entry of the "artist's exhibit."

The museum director also shocked us by telling us something we had never been told before: that it was this same artist who had first approached the Jewish Museum Vienna many years ago with the idea of a Reich Exhibit, and that it was he who had recommended this curator for the exhibit. We wish we had known.

And now, let us move on to 2008.
